A THIRTY-YEAR-OLD MOTHER AND HER FOUR-YEAR-OLD DAUGHTER, CYNTHIA.

Melissa had been married for 7 years when she reported her husband was verbally and physically abusive towards her. Unfortunately, Cynthia was the object of his anger too, and a witness to domestic violence. Cynthia was yelled at and physically punished for common child behaviors. When Cynthia's dad left their home, mom and daughter found themselves in a very difficult financial situation; they lost their apartment and were forced to lean on family and friends for help.

Melissa came to CAPC for support. Our case manager assessed the family situation and found that she suffered from depression and low self-esteem, while Cynthia showed symptoms of separation anxiety. She would not let go of her mom's hand and would constantly cry and retreat quietly. Our caseworker designed a plan of action for the family and visited them twice a week.

After a couple of months, with care and counseling, Melissa started to get her confidence back, and soon found a job which later led her to finding their new home.

She shared, "... no more sleeping in half of a living room. I'm grateful for the help I had and I'm so excited we have our new home now." Melissa was very receptive to learning new coping skills, which she gained from the professional referrals CAPC provided. Our Basic Needs program

immediately helped them with food, a bunk bed for Cynthia, a refrigerator and basic home items. Little Cynthia is connected to Head Start for daycare support while mom works, and she is making new friends.

Thanks to you, this family is moving forward, filled with hope. Cynthia even signed up to join a ballerina studio for dance classes and was so happy to see her own tutu and ballet slippers!

Melissa overcame incredible pain and struggles. Today, she wants to fulfill her eager heart and learn more so that she can continue to provide for her daughter.

You have turned hurt into HOPE! Your support has made this family, and many others prevail under tenuous circumstances, and you are encouraging them to move forward. Thank you!
